## Passing of Mr. M. B. O'Donnell, N.T.

As an old Gael and a firstclass football exponent in his day, he took the keenest interest in the national pastimes and in Irish athletics in general. He was for the past lew years President of the Limerick County Board of the N.A.C.A. In a busy life deceased found time to take an active part in the Gaelie League, the U.A A. the Uatholic 1 ruth Society, and in fact to everything that appertained to the social and onitural life of Newcastle West. For several years he held the position of Secretary to the Newcastie West bhow, and his wonderful energy in that capacity contributed to make that fixture such an outstanding one up to the time of its discontinuance a lew years ago. Undoubtedry a great personality has passed on, one whose memory will be ever cherished wherever the Gael and the sportsman meet.
