

Limerick Lady's Death

A Son and Four Daughters in Religion

The death took place at her residence, Clara View, Ennis Road, Limerick, on the 21st inst, of Mrs Mary Cahill, relict of the late Michael Cahill, tobacco manufacturer, and mother of Rev John Cahill, Glasnevin, Dublin, and of four nuns:—Rev Mother Winifred, Sister Ita, Sister Michael (Sisters of Charity, Ghent), and Sister Aquin, of the Mercy Order, Limerick. Deceased was a very charming personality, and was held in the highest esteem and respect during her long and holy life.

The remains were removed to St Munchin's Church on Monday night, and on Tuesday morning Requiem Mass was celebrated, after which the funeral took place to Mount St Lawrence Cemetery, followed by a huge concourse of mourners and the general public, which included his Worship the Mayor and other representative citizens.
