Shocking Tragedy

Young City Girl Killed

A fourteen-year-old girl was killed under very tragic circumstances at Singland, near Limerick, on Saturday, when a bicycle which she was riding came into collision with a private motor car. She was Mary Carey, who resided with her father at Back Clare street, Limerick.

Her mother died only a month ago and she was the eldest of the family.

The girl was cycling towards Limerick at the time of the accident and the car being driven out from the city. The driver, in an effort to avoid her, turned towards the bank at the left-hand side of the road. The car struck the bank and overturned on its side and the girl was pinned underneath.

The driver of the car was Mr C W O London, director Messrs Rank (Ireland) Ltd, Limerick, who was fortunate in escaping with a bad shaking. He was assisted out of the car by some spectators.

In order to extricate the girl the vehicle had to be turned completely upside down. It was then found that the girl was dead, having sustained shocking head and face injuries. The body was removed to the Limerick County Infirmary. Both the car and the bicycle were only very slightly damaged.

The Inquest

An inquest was opened this noon by Dr A Murnane-Power, coroner, at the County Courthouse.

Evidence of identification was given by the father of deceased, Cornelius Carey, and after medical evidence the inquest was adjourned indefinitely on the application of Inspector Brassil.

Sympathy was tendered to the relatives by the coroner and jury.
