

# Boy's Sad Death

## Struck by Motor Car

### Inquest in Limerick

The death occurred at the Limerick Co. Infirmary on Monday morning of David Breagh, 14½ years, of John street, as a result of injuries received when struck by a motor car on Friday evening, when he was cycling in the vicinity of the Fair Green.

Mr J S McNeice, solr, Deputy Coroner, with a jury, opened an inquest on Monday evening touching the death of deceased.

Supt. Meehan conducted the inquiry, and Mr D J O'Malley, solr, appeared for the driver of the car, Mr Martin O'Connor, Summerville Avenue, Limerick.

The Superintendent stated that he proposed only to offer evidence of identification and medical evidence, and would then apply for an adjournment pending any other proceedings that might be taken.

John Breagh, father of the deceased boy, identified the remains as that of his son, whom, he said, had enjoyed perfect health prior to the occurrence.

Dr Bridget Crawford, House Surgeon, County Infirmary, stated deceased was unconscious when admitted to the institution on Friday evening. He was suffering from a fracture of the base of the skull, and also a fracture of the right leg. Death, in her opinion, was due to shock following fracture of the skull.

At this stage the Coroner adjourned the inquest sine die, and joined with the jury in expressing sympathy with the relatives of deceased.

Supt. Meehan and Mr O'Malley joined in the expression of sympathy.
