"Mick" Hemessey, as he was popularly known, had been Lieutenant of the old Baltingaddy Company of the IRA, and had taken a very active part in all the old IRA, antivities since 1817. He fought through the Angle Irish and Civil ware—in the latter as a member of the East Limerick Brigade Plying column.

During the Angle-Irish war he was captured and hadly beaten by the British forces, while during the Civil war he was captured and contended to death. While under the death sent-socs he made a dramatic catapt from Limerick Prison, but in
