Remains of Rev. J. Cahill Laid to Rest.

The remains of Rev. J. Cahill, C.O., Glasnevin, whose death occurred in Dublin on Friday, were interred in Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery, Limerick, yesterday.

The funeral arrived by road from Dublin, where solemn Office and Requiem Mass were chanted in the Church of the Seven Dolours, Glasnevin. The deceased priest was a native of Limerick City, and his death, which occurred unexpectedly, was learned with deep regret by a large circle of friends.
