IMPRESSIVE OBSEQUIES

Funeral of Late Rev. J. Collier

Huge Gathering of Clergy

The death occurred sudden'y at the Convent of St. John of God. Waterford, on Sunday morning, of Rev. James Collier, C.SS.R., of Mount St. Alphonsus, Limerick. Father Collier had arrived at Waterford from Galway the previous night to open a mission.

The late Father Collier was a brother of Most Rev. Dr. Collier, Bishop of Ossory, and also of Very Rev. Daniel Collier, O.M.I., Dublin. He was born at Camross, Ossory, in 1872, and received his early education at St. Kiernan's College, Kilkenny.

He entered the Redemptorist Novitiate at Liverpool, where he was professed in 1894, and he completed his higher studies at Teignmouth, Devonshire. He was ordained in 1900.

NOTED MISSIONER.

For almost 40 years he had been engaged in the work of parochial missions, and he was very much in demand for Retreats to clergy and religious of both sexes. From 1918 to 1921 he held the post of Rector at St. Joseph's, Dundalk, and since 1936 he had been Consultor to the Very Rev. Father Provincial, at Limerick.

The death of Father Collier has been a great loss to his Congregation, and he will be keenly missed by the numerous people who had received his spiritual ministrations throughout Ireland.

THE OBSEQUIES.

Impressive scenes were witnessed at Mount St. Alphonsus Church, Limerick, on Tuesday, when the remains of the late Father James Collier, C.SS.R., were laid to rest. Over 150 priests from all parts of Ireland were present at the obsequies.

Requiem Mass was celebrated by Most Rev. Dr. Collier, D.D., Bishop of Ossory, brother of the deceased priest, and amongst the huge attendant were numerous clergy from the diocese of Ossory.
