James Mc'oney, Ardnacrusha, brought a claim for £4 5s. against the Celtic Cleaners, O'Connell Street, Limerick, in respect of a coat sent to the defendants for the purpose of having it cleaned.

Mr J. S. McNeice, solicitor, asked for permission to enter a late defence. -

The application was refused.

The plaintiff's case showed that a suit which he left in to be cleaned with the defendants was not returned. He was informed that the coat had been lost. The remainder of the suit, which cost £4 5s. originally was no use without the jacket.

Mr McNeice said that the coat was stolen by an employee of the defendants.

The Justice gave a decree for the amount claimed, and said if Mr. McNeice had been instructed in time he could have put up a very good defence.

JUVENILE OFFENDERS.

At Limerick Juvenile Court on Saturday a number of little girls were prosecuted for larceny from city shops.

District Justice Flood, in applying the Probation of Offenders Act, said it was extremely difficult to deal adequately with juvenile offenders. They gave far more trouble than adults, and, as he had said, on previous occasions, the number of such offenders indicated a deplorable lack of parental control.
