CARDINAL INNITZER.

According to persistent rumours, which cannot yet be confirmed, Cardinal Innitzer is to retire.

Rumours that Card nal Innitezr would resign first became current soon after his palace was sacked by a mob last October. It was then said that he would be attached to the Vatican and would be succeeded as Archbishop of Vienna by one of the Bishops in North Germany, probab'y Count von Preysing, Bishop of Berlin.

The Cardinal, who has expressed anti-Nazi views, was a close friend of Dr. Schuschnigg, the former Austrian Chancellor. It is said that Dr. Schuschnigg -never made an important decision without first consulting the Cardinal.

CERTAINS PREPAREDNESS.

Germany's preparedness was emphasised by Grand Admiral Raeder, Commander-in-Chief of the German Navy, in a speech at the Navy League rally in Dresden. That the rally should coinc de with the twenty-fifth anniversary of the war, he said, gave it an especial meaning, as, just as in 1914, the Powers hostile to Germany were once more at work to encircle Germany in order to wipe her out by a worse treaty than that of Versailles.
