Fell Into Docks.

During the unloading of a cargo boat at Limerick dock yesterday, a horse and cart belonging to one of the hauliers fell over the quay. The animal was drowned before the efforts to rescue it could be effective. The cart was subsequently recovered from the river, where it had become embedded in the mud.

PETROL

ANOTHER INCREASE IN ENGLAND.

In London petrol will to-morrow be 1½d. dearer at 1/9½ a gallon, the highest price for 15 years. Simultaneously with this announcement, the Petroleum Board gave an assurance that the quality of the "pool" product will be kept as high as possible—but it may not always be practicable to reserve for civilian use grade which may be required for war purposes. The increase has been agreed to by the British Government. Existing differentials in price will be continued for the north and west of Scotland, etc., and for deliveries in packages. It is pointed out that when the last increase—2d. per gallon—was made on October 17, it was stated that this only partly reflected the recent increase in costs.
