Very Rev John Canon Burke, PP, vP, KO HB, died on Sunday last at the residence of his brother in law, Mr John McGrath, at King's Square, Mitchelstown.

The late Canon Barke was born at Glenlara, Kilfinane, and was ordained at St. Patrick's College, Thurles, in 1886 At the time of his death be was pastor of Bolton. On the occasion of his sacerdotal golden three years ago, the late Pops, in recognition of his work for Catholic education, conferred on Canon Barke the order of Knight Commander of the Holy Sepulchre. The brief and insignia were brought from Rome by the Right Rev Monsignor Duche-

At the Golden Jubilee celebrations, held at Thornleigh College, the Bishop of Salford (Dr. Henshaw) said he only knew of one other in the diocese who had ever been so honoured by the Holy Father. Due to the initiative of the late Canon, and his crusade on behalf of Catholic education the boys of Bolton had secured a splendid secondary school.
