

Limerick P.P. Dead

Passing of Rev Fr T Nolan, Kilteely

The death occurred at the Parochial House on Saturday night of Rev Thomas Nolan, P.P., Kilteely, county Limerick.

Born at Killeenale, county Tipperary, the late Father Nolan was educated at Thurles College, where he was ordained in 1897. After his ordination he went on the English Mission, was recalled after about 12 years, and was Secretary to Most Rev Dr Fennelly, Archbishop of Cashel, for two years.

After filling curacies at Boberlahane and Kilteely he was in 1931 appointed Parish Priest of Kilteely, and was responsible for clearing a parochial debt of £1,200 in that parish. During the troubled period Fr Nolan ministered to wounded men following the Dromkeen ambush.

Deceased was brother of Right Rev Monsignor Nolan, P.P., V.C. Tipperary.

At the removal of the remains on Sunday night to the church the large crowd of clergy and laity testified to the deep sense of sorrow which his death evoked.

Office and Solemn Requiem High Mass was celebrated at Kilteely Parish Church this (Tuesday) morning.
