## Passing of Mr M. Cregan

Members of the Flying Columns of the Old First Southern Division of the IRA, at home and in the will learn with regret of the death of Mr Michael Cregan which occurred at his residence, Ballyshans, Newcastle West.

He was a member of the Irish Republican Brotherhous and one of the earliest

members of Sinn Fein in Limerick.

During the Anglo Irish streggle his sons took a prominent part in the fighting. His residence, which had been used as Brigade Headquarters, was raided daily until the Truce. In one of the raids Mr Cregan was savagely beaten by Black and Tans and received injuries from which he suff-red until his death.

His sons—Comett Con Cregan, now in

New York, and Mr Ned Cregan, the noted hurler, then a Brigade Staff offi er were among the first in the list of IRA men "wanted" by the British in Munster.

Mr Cregan was also father of Mr Patk Cregan, Dublin, and of Lieut Michael Cregan.
