

Limerick Fatality

Citizen Killed In Collision

The Inquest

Patrick Fitzgerald, labourer, aged 50, High Road, Thomondgate, Limerick, died in Barrington's Hospital on Saturday morning following injuries received when in a collision with a car driven by Inspector Falvey, G.S. Limerick, on the Dublin Road on Friday evening.

Mr J S McNeice, city coroner, sitting with a jury, held an inquest on the remains in Barrington's Hospital on Saturday.

Supt Denneby conducted the proceedings for the State; Mr N Gaffney, solr., appeared for Inspector Falvey.

Wm Fitzgerald, 51 High Road, Thomondgate, son of the deceased, identified the remains. He last saw his father alive at about 10.45 on Friday morning, and he was then in his usual health. He was a man of temperate habits.

Dr M P Hickey, Barrington's Hospital, stated he examined deceased shortly after admission about 11 o'clock. He was suffering from shock and in a state of collapse. He died at 1.30 on Saturday morning. Death was due to laceration of the right lung.

This concluded the evidence and the proceedings were adjourned.

Mr Gaffney, on behalf of Inspector Falvey, expressed sympathy with the relatives of the deceased.

The coroner and jury associated themselves with the expression of sympathy.
