## Passing of Mr. Charlie Holland

With most sincere regret we place on record the death of Mr Charlie Holland, the well-known Limerick Gael, which occurred at Rarrington's Hospital on Sunday night after a protracted illness.

For close on half a century deceased gentleman was an active worker in the Gaelic Athletic Association, whether as Treasurer or Secretary of the Limerick Co Board, or as that body's representative on the Munster or Central Councils. Ever marked with a genial and unassuming disposition, he brought to bear on his duties a commonsense and broadmindedness that enhanced him in the esteem of his colleagues.

A native of Cork, Mr Holland came to Limerick as a very young man, and in the business of umbrella manufacturer had developed a lucrative trade in the city of his adoption. By his demise the G.A.A. has lost a self sacrificing and conscientious worker, his family a most affectionate parent, and those who had the pleasure of his acquaintance a sincere friend.

Accompanied by a huge cortege, the remains were removed from the Hospital last evening to St. Michael's Church, where Requiem Mass for the repose of his soul was celebrated this morning.

The funeral to Mount St Lawrence Cemetery this afternoon was again a most striking demonstration of esteem and respect to the memory of one who was so deservedly popular with all classes.
