The death of Mrs. Catherine Fitzgerald, wife of Mr. Denis J. Fitzgerald, of Glenesrone, Abbeyfeale, which occurred in the maternity ward of a Limerick

hospital on Saturday, came as a shock to her bereaved husband and many relatives in Limerick and Kerry. Deceased was only 35, and had been married only a few years. The little casket laid on the bier, beside her own, intensified the feelings of sympathy so widely felt for those who composed a happy family circle. Deceased was beloved and esteemed amongst numerous friends, because of a naturally kind, unaffected disposition devoted to the constant exercise of kind and benevolent acts. On Sunday evening the remains were conveyed from Limerick to St. Mary's Church, Abbeyfeale, and only on rare occasions in the district have the numbers been exceeded that joined in the cortege on the way. The funeral on Monday to Kilshenane Cemetery, where the interment took place in the family plot, was of equally large proportions.
