## SISTER M. BERNARD DALY, NEWTOWNBARRY.

The death has taken place of Sister M. Bernard Daly, Convent F.G.J., Newtownbarry, Co. Wexford. Deceased was eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Daly, "Liosgreine," Castletown, Charleville. She entered the Order in Brussels, where her solemn profession took place over a year ago, and was subsequently transferred to Newtownbarry, where she had a very brilliant course of studies prior to entering the religious life.
