GRAND OPERA

C.B.S. CHORAL CLASS

Ancient Greece was the birthplace of
classical opera. The first grand opera,
"Euridice," produced in London, 1600,
was the old Greek myth of Orpheus and
Euridice wedded to music and declama-
tion.

W. V. Wallace (1814-1865), the com-
poser of "Maritana," was born in
Waterford of Scottish parents. His
musical gifts were developed by study
and travel. "Maritana" was first pro-
duced in London, 1845, and won immediate
favour with the public owing to its rich
musical fancy and romantic setting. Its
bewitching numbers have captivated
audiences for almost a century.

Excellence in vocal technique and
dramatic art supported by full orchestral
effects will make the opera, to be pro-
duced by the C.B.S. Choral Class on
