John Loftus, Glenameade, Kilcornan, Richard Millar, Dromlohan, Kilnash, for £8, 14s. 10d., balance of wages due to be due.

Mr. Martin Tynan, solicitor, appeared for plaintiff, and Mr. M. F. Noonan, solicitor (Messrs. P. T. Liston and Co., solicitors), appeared for defendant.

Plaintiff, in evidence, said he was first employed by defendant in May, 1938. He continued to work for him until the 4th of January, 1939, when defendant agreed to hire him for a further twelve months, his wages to be £20. He worked for the defendant until January 9th, when he was told to go. Witness was quite definite that the last arrangement was for twelve months. When witness left he had been paid £6 and after the 9th of January he received £3 13s. 2d.

Mr. Tynan said that according to his accounts the actual amount due was £8 14s. 4d.

PLAINTIFF CROSS-EXAMINED.

Plaintiff, cross-examined by Mr. Noonan, admitted that he had received wages totalling £6 10s. before leaving defendant's employment.

Mrs. Kate Loftus corroborated plaintiff's evidence regarding the terms of contract and alleged that her son had received £6 before he was told to go.

Defendant, in reply to Mr. Noonan, said that her son only received £6 before he was told to go.

Defendant, in reply to Mr. Noonan, said that in 1939 he hired defendant at a rate of £20 per year. After he was told plaintiff told him that he only intended to be hired until Christmas.

On Christmas came witness told him his time was up and asked him what he intended doing. Plaintiff then said his time would not be up until the following May. He then left of his own accord and witness sent him a cheque for the balance of the wages due to him. Witness did not owe the plaintiff anything whatever.
