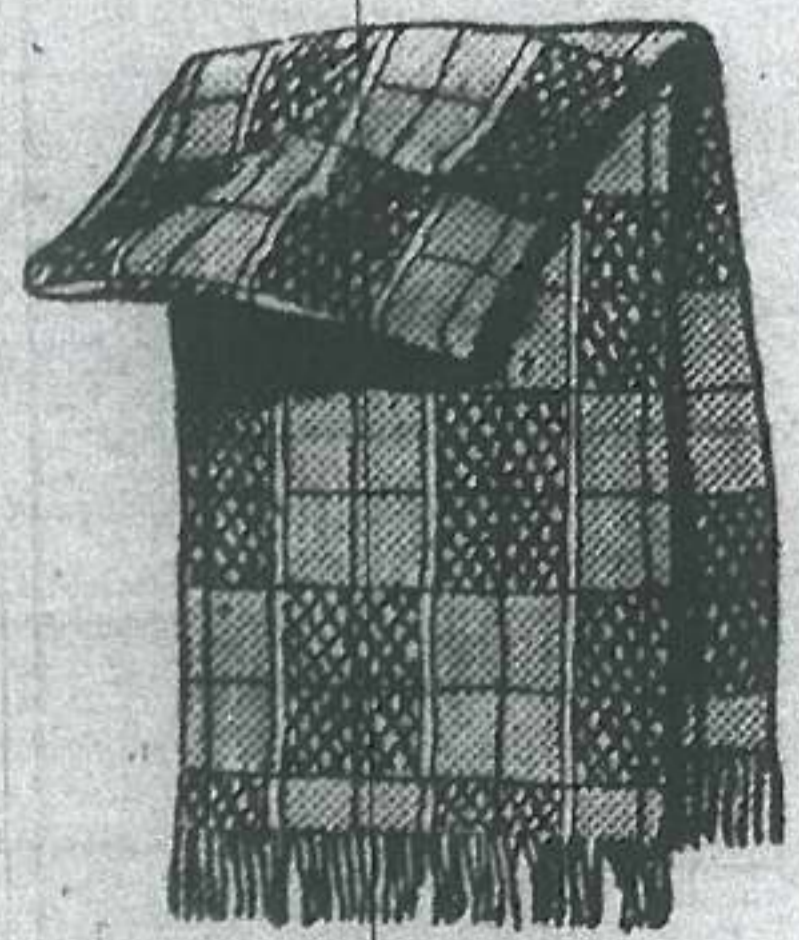

SON OF ASKEATON PARENTS

The death took place in Barrington's Hospital, Limerick, on Saturday, 30th ult., after a few days illness, of Master Tommie Fitzgerald, aged 8, dearly beloved son of Garda and Mrs. Fitzgerald, Cloughjordan, natives of Askeaton, Co. Limerick. The following account of the obsequies is from the Cloughjordan District Notes in the 'Nenagh Guardian':—

"On Sunday, at the 11 a.m. Mass, Rev. Father Meehan, C.C., in asking for prayers for the repose of his soul, said he could not let the occasion pass without stating that on the previous Sunday Tommie Fitzgerald, in his capacity as altar boy, assisted and served the Holy Mass in that Church, and to-day, please God, he assists and serves at the Throne of God in Heaven."

"On Sunday evening an immense concourse of people from the town and district escorted the remains to St. Michael and St. John's Church, where, encased in a small white coffin, the remains were received by Rev. Father Meehan and Rev. Father Minahan."

"On Monday Solemn Requiem Mass was offered, the clergy officiating being Rev. Father Meehan, C.C.; Rev. Father Minahan, C.C., and Rev. Father Daly, C.C., Shinrone."

"The interment afterwards took place in the grounds adjoining the Church. All his schoolmates and fellow altar boys were in attendance at the obsequies.—R.I.P."
