DEATH OF MR. M. S. FITZGIBBON

The death of Mr. Maurice S. Fitzgibbon, which we regret to announce, took place this morning at his daughter's residence, "Cader Idris," O'Connell Ave. He had attained to an advanced age, and had not been in good health for some time past.
