DEATH OF MISS M. FLYNN, ABBEYFEALE

The death of Miss Mary Flynn, of Main
Street, Abbeyfeale, evoked feelings of

45. For more than half that time she

Possessed of a natural gift of gentle,
cheery kindness, she commanded the
esteem and confidence of many friends
to the end. Her death was in keeping
with a life of exemplary attachment to
the Church, and her loyalty to the
Sodality of Mary was not forgotten by
the Children of Mary, who paid their
last tribute in their robes at the grave-
side. Nor did the many friends who

cards on her bier, or send some touch of
kindly remembrance in their messages of
sympathy to her bereaved relatives. At
