OBITUARY

MR. JOHN GERARD JUDGE.

The death took place on Saturday, 18th May, at his residence, 15, Sexton Street, Limerick, of Mr. John Gerard Judge, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Judge, and brother of Rev. P. Judge, C.S.Sp., Nigeria.

The deceased was for many years a faithful and conscientious employee of Messrs. J. & G. Boyd, as evidenced by the fact that the firm closed down their establishment for the funeral, which was large and representative of the business and social life of the city, and testified to the esteem enjoyed by the deceased and his family. The late Mr. Judge was in the prime of life, and had a charming manner, which endeared him to all with whom he came in contact. He had been in failing health for some months past, and death was not altogether unexpected. To his bereaved parents and relatives we extend our deep sympathy.
