THE FLY (TREATMENT OF CATTLE) ORDERS, 1936 & 1939.

It is hereby given that the above
Orders (amended by the Warble Fly
Act of Cattle) (Amendment)
No. 6, requires that all cattle in-
cluding the Larvae of the Warble
be dressed with Cattle Wash
in a preparation approved by
the Minister of Agriculture between the
fourth days (both days inclusive)
of the months, March, April, May,
and July. The Cattle Wash must
be used by the owner or person in
charge of the cattle in such a manner
that it will come into contact with the
cattle through the Warble swellings in
the skin of the Cattle.

The mode of treatment for Warble
is other than the foregoing is
not valid for the purposes of the

Orders of the preparation for making
such are required to be sold in
packages bearing a printed indica-
tion of the Minister's approval.

It is to be noted that it is
the duty of the Inspectors appoin-
ted under the Order to be present at the
dressing.

Penalties against the Order entail
