The Funeral

The funeral of the late Miss Hodgson, formerly Principal of the Infants' Department in the Model Schools, Limerick, took place yesterday from St. Michael's Church to St. Munchin's.

The Service was held in St. Michael's, the officiating clergy being the Very Rev. G. L. Swain, Dean of Limerick, and the Rev. A. E. Hewetson-Jones. Owing to illness, the Rev. Treasurer Abbott, Rector of the Parish, and the Rev. Precentor Atkinson were unable to be present.

The 23rd Psalm, and the hymn "Jerusalem the Golden," played by Mr. Norman Gale, organist, were beautifully and feelingly sung by the choir.

As the procession moved from the church, "O Rest in the Lord" was played, and the ladies in the choir bore the wreaths to the waiting hearse.

At St. Munchin's, after the coffin was lowered into the grave, which was lined with evergreen, the simple but impressive Service was ended by the Dean pronouncing the Committal Sentences.
