GREAT LIMERICK NUN

Dies In Australia

LAST OF A PIONEER BAND

The death took place on the 1st of September, in the Presentation Convent, Windsor, Australia, of Rev. Mother Mary Xavier Mackey, the last of the pioneer band who, in 1873, founded the first Presentation Convent in that country.

Mother Mary Xavier was a native of Castleconnell, Co. Limerick, being a sister of the late Mr. Anthony Mackey, of the Fisheries.

WENT WITH THE FOUNDRESS.

As a postulant she went to Australia with the foundress, Mother M. Paul Mulquin, and five professed Sisters. Mother M. Xavier received the religious habit in St. Mary's Church, St. Kilda, in July, 1874.

In 1937 she had the privilege of celebrating the diamond jubilee of her profession. The greetings from far and near received by her on that occasion testified to the love and esteem in which she was held by past pupils and friends.

GIFTED ARTIST AND MUSICIAN.

For many years, Mother Xavier, a gifted artist and musician, was actively engaged in the work of education, and when ill-health prevented activity, she still continued to take a keen interest in the progress of the schools.

Revered by the Community and pupils for her kindness and true nobility of character, as well as for her association with the traditions of the convent from its foundation, Mother Xavier gave an example of zealous enthusiasm for the cause of Christ.

ARCHBISHOP MANNIX PRESIDES AT REQUIEM MASS.

In the convent chapel, his Grace the Archbishop, Most Rev. Dr. Mannix, presided at a Requiem Mass for Mother M. Xavier. Over fifty priests attended, as well as representatives of the Christian Brothers' and the De La Salle Communities. Many old friends and past pupils were present at the Mass and at the interment in the St. Kilda Cemetery. R.I.P.
