# DEATH OF DUBLIN OFFICIAL

### Native of Limerick

Mr. Michael Joseph McEnery, Deputy Keeper of Public Records and Keeper of State Papers for all Ireland, 1914-'21, died on Tuesday, 12th inst., at his residence, Highfield Road, Dublin, at the fine age of 82.

Born in Co. Limer ck, Mr. McErery was educated in the old Queen's College, Cork, where his course was very distinguished. A prizeman all through, he graduated in law, and subsequently entered the Civil Service, passing in third in class I. He entered the Public Record Office in 1881, where he spent his entire official career of 40 years, filling successifully every post. In 1911 indeed a special post was created for him—that of an Extra Assistant Keeper of Records, with the duty of translating difficult documents for the British Museum.
