Not alone had his admonitions gone unheeded but in this case no regret apparently expressed for the conduct which converted the thoroughfare into a racing track. To allow such a state of things go unpunished would give others carte blanche to behave similarly, and no decent citizen with a thought for the safety of his fellow beings will quarrel with the decision of Mr. Flood, whose clemency in the discharge of his duties is well known. If there was ever a man that made it a practice to temper justice with mercy and make allowance for human frailty, he is none other than our District Justice.
