## MRS. MARY NEVILLE, BALLINAGUILLE, CROAGH.

The death of this highly-esteemed lady occurred at her residence, Ballinaguille, on the 28th August, at the advanced age of 84 years. The deceased lady all through her life was an exemplary Catholic and was the mother of four nuns. From her early youth she was imbued with a high spirit of patriotism. Her home was time and again raided during the troubled times in pursuit of her sons, Jack and Tom, together with their comrades, who frequently found shelter under her roof, irrespective of the consequences. She was mother of Michael, who figured in several All-Ireland Hurling finals, representing Dublin and Limerick. Her remains were removed to the parish church, Croagh, on Wednesday evening, followed by a huge concourse of friends and sympathisers. On Thursday her funeral took place to the family burial ground, Adare, and was one of the largest seen for a very long number of years, which was a striking testimony to the esteem held for the deceased and members of her family. It would be an impossibility to give a full list of the general public who attended the funeral. Letters and telegrams were numerous from G.A.A. old comrades who fought with Jack and Tom and Gaels who played with Mick in the All-Ireland matches for Dublin and Limerick.
