for a workman the Justice would have to decide the issue on the question of the greater hardsbip as between plaintiff and defendant. He (Mr. Leahy) submitted that the greater hardship would be inflicted on the defendant if he were put out of the house.

Mr. Noohan contended that the plaintiff was entitled to possession of the house for a workman in order that he could comply with the increased tillage regulations. If he did not comply with the regulations he would be heavily pen-

alised.

Mr. Leahy-The tenant says he cannot get a house and it would be a greater hardship on him if he is put out.
