MR. WILLIAM C O'KEEFE  
MEENSCOVANE, ABBEYFEALE.

Widespread sympathy marked the passing away of the late Mr. William C. O'Keefe, Meenscovane, Abbeyfeale, who died at the residence of his late brother on the 25th ult. at the age of 80 years. Belonging to an old respected family, deceased was looked up to as a man of sound knowledge and prudence. He received his early education at St. Michael's College, Liscrow, and later on in life he augmented his studies by more advanced courses in the U.S.A. The late Mr. O'Keefe was an outstanding authority in educational and historical matters. His sister, who also passed away recently, was a member of the Mercy Order at Cahirciveary (Sister Patricia) P.L. Having spent the early years of his life in U.S.A., he returned to his native home in 1914, where he resided ever since at the home of his brother, (the late Mr. F. O'Keefe, M.C.C.) up to his demise. His illness was of short duration and he retained consciousness to the end. He passed away peacefully after having received spiritual and medical aid.

Numerous telegrams and messages of sympathy were received by his relatives.

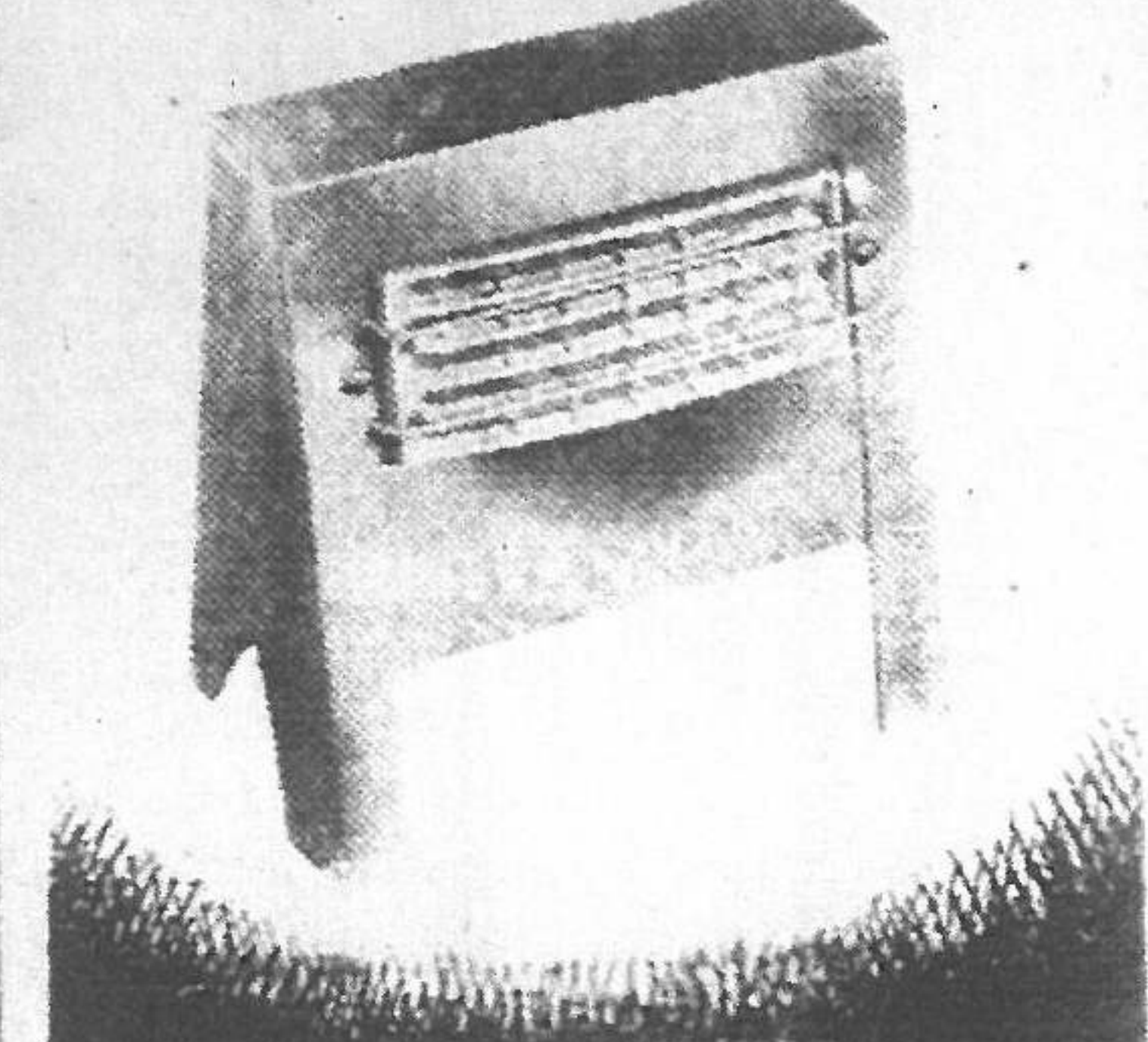
The remains, which were conveyed to St. Mary's Church, Abbeyfeale, on the 29th ult., were accompanied by a large concourse of people.

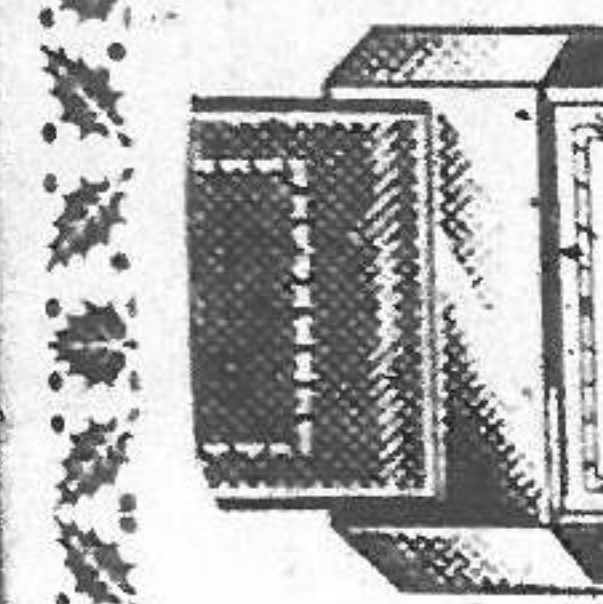

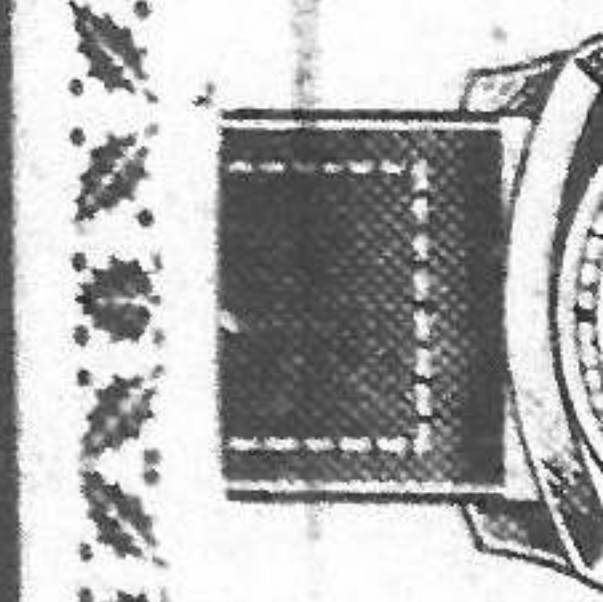
