MR. WILLIAM C. O'KEEFE,
MEENSCOVANE, ABBEYFEALE.

Widespread sympathy marked the passing away of the late Mr. William C. O'Keeffe, Meenscovane, Abbeyfeale, who died recently at the residence of his late brother on the 23rd ult., aged 80 years. Belonging to an old respected family, deceased was looked upon as a man of sound knowledge and prudence. He received his early education at S. Michael's College, Lismore, and later on in life he augmented his studies by attending courses in the U.S.A. The late Mr. O'Keeffe was an orator and authority in educational and historical matters. His sister, who also passed away recently, was a nun of the Mercy Order at Cahirciveen. He had spent the early years of his life in U.S.A., he returned to Ireland and took up residence on the 4th August, 1914, where he resided ever since at the home of his brother, (the late Mr. F. O'Keeffe, M.C.C.) up to his demise. His illness was of short duration and he retained consciousness to the end. He passed away peacefully after having received spiritual and medical aid.

Numerous telegrams and messages of sympathy were received by his relatives.

The remains, which were conveyed to St. Mary's Church, Abbeyfeale, on the 29th ult., were accompanied by a large concourse of people.

The interment took place on the following day in the family burial place, Old Abbey Cemetery, Abbeyfeale.


