Mr. T. J. Prendergast.

We regret to record the death, which
occurred on Thursday at his residence,
10 Lord Edward Street, of Mr. Thomas
J. Prendergast, former Sub-Sheriff, after
an illness of some duration.

The late Mr. Prendergast was a well-
known and popular personality in the
city, and up to his retirement from the
position of Sub-Sheriff in 1933 took an
active part in civic affairs. He was for-
