Funeral of Mr. Wm. Purtill.

Large Attendance.

The funeral of Mr. William Purtill, ex-N.T., Foynes, Co. Limerick, who was killed in an accident on Tuesday, 2nd inst., took place after Solemn Requiem Mass in Foynes Church to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery. The celebrant of the Mass was Rev. M. Purtill (son of the deceased); deacon, Rev. M. Breen, St. Munchin's College; sub-deacon, Rev. H. Murphy, St. Munchin's College, Limerick; Master of Ceremonies, Rev.
