## DEEPLY REGRETTED

#### DEATH OF MR. M. QUILLIGAN

With very much regret we announce the death of Mr. Michael Quilligan, who passed away at his residence, 15 Westfields, North Circular Road, Limerick, on Saturday. The deceased, who had been in poor health for a considerable time back, carried on successfully the business of licensed vintner and grocer in Mungret Street. In his business dealings, as indeed in all his relations in life, he was honourable, upright and unselfish to the highest degree.
