EXPORT AND BACON COMMISSION

Representative of the Commission
will inspect pigs from producers delivered
in good condition. Pigs will be exported
on behalf of the producers. Pay-
ment sum not exceeding £4 in re-
spect of any one pig will be made to
producer as soon as possible after
export of such pig. The balance of
proceeds will be returned to producers as
soon as payment from the British market

Export of pigs on behalf of pro-
ducers. The Commission will act as their
agent. The price to be returned to the
producer for such pigs will be that
obtained in the export market, after de-
duction of necessary expenses (including
freight) incurred in the export.

Pigs weighing not less than 1-0-7
liveweight will be accepted, producers
understanding that they may be dis-
satisfied with the prices which will be
obtained if they insist on exporting pigs
weighing less than 2-0-7 liveweight or
less.
