DEATH OF MR. J. SHEEHAN

We regret to announce the death of Mr. John Sheehan, which took place at his daughter's residence, 14 Crescent Avenue last night. He had been ill only a short time, and had reached an advanced age. Mr. Sheehan was a well-known and respected citizen—a valued member of Limerick Typographical Society, in which he formerly held office. A skilled craftsman, he was for many years foreman compositor of the "Munster News," in the production of which he gave the benefit of his ability and mature experience. On severing his connection with that journal he went into the job printing side of the industry, and retired some years back from active participation in the pursuit of his craft. He was an ex-member of the Corporation, and a man whose amiability and upright character made him numerous friends, who will mourn his passing, and offer sympathy to his family in their bereavement.

The remains will be removed at 9 o'clock this evening to St. Michael's Church, and to-morrow, at 3 p.m., the funeral will leave for Mount St. Laurence Cemetery.
