DUKE SHELTERS FROM AIR

RAID

Four minutes after the Duke of Kent
had completed an inspection of an aero-
drome during an extensive tour of the
Kent area on Saturday, bombs were
dropped near the aerodrome. The Duke
went to a shelter and lunched there many
feet below the chalk cliffs.

Earlier, says the British Air Ministry
News Service, the Duke called upon a bat-
talion of a regiment of which he is
Colonel-in-Chief, and while on a visit to
Vice-Admiral Sir Bertram Ramsey at
Dover, witnessed a lively air battle over
the Channel.
