It was to this home that Mr de Valera went three days blore he addressed the historis meeting at Konis in August, 1923, when he was arrested.

Killalos.

Mr de Valera was represented at the funeral by Senator T V Honan, chairman, konis Urban Connell. The interment took place at Dromcliffe cometery after Solemn Requiem Mass.
