

Cattle Dealer's Tragic Death

Limerickman Gored to Death by a Bull.

A sad tragedy occurred at Lieduane, Graaagh, about six miles from Croom, when Michael O'Brien, a well known cattle-dealer, who resided in a Limerick hotel, a native of the Caberconlish district, met his death through being gored by a bull. It appears that the unfortunate man was on a visit to his niece, Mrs J Carroll, during which he went on a tour of the farm and inspection of the dairy cows and other livestock on the lands. His absence was not noticed for some time, and when it became known that he had not put in an appearance, the members of the family became uneasy and a search was made, and resulted in the tragic discovery of the body of deceased lying close to a fence in a field in which a bull and other cattle were kept. Life was then extinct, to the horror of the Carroll family, to whom the sad occurrence has come at a terrible shock. Deceased had journeyed from Limerick on the day previous to visit the family, as had been a custom of his. He was aged about 60 and unmarried.
