

Death of Mr. Thomas J. Prendergast.

The death, which we sincerely regret to announce, occurred at his residence, Lord Edward street, on Thursday afternoon of Mr Thomas J Prendergast. He had been ailing for some time. The deceased gentleman was for a long number of years Sub-Sheriff for the city—a position in which he gave complete satisfaction. He was the last occupant of the office, retiring in 1933, the position becoming vested in the County Registrar. During his occupancy of the position he was frequently called upon to present white gloves as an emblem of the peace of the city to the Circuit Court Judge. He was elected as Alderman of the Limerick Corporation at the inception of the Local Government Act, 1899, and held the confidence of the electors of the Glentworth Ward for a number of years until his retirement. A keen sportsman in his day, deceased was one of the oldest members of the Garryowen Football Club, for whom he played many a game as forward. Deceased was also a keen musician, and was a member of the Boherbuoy Band when that gifted corps of instrumentalists brought many honours to Limerick.
