## Death of Mr Patrick Carey

It is with very sincere regret that we have to record the death of Mr Patrick Carey, furniture ren-over and general haulage contractor, which sad event took place at his residence, Upper Cecil street, Limerick, early on Tuesday morning last. Deceased had not been in the best of health for some time back, but nevertheless he was enabled to be out and about his business to the last, his death coming as a great shock to his devoted widow and family.
