Nichael Daly, So, father of the child, said he had been missing from his home since 6.20 on Friday evening; he had been about the house prior to that time, and when he was missed witness west to search of him; witness had seven other children, and decessed was five years of age.

With a man named Kevin Stackpoole he recovered the high with a drag. It was lying in about 6 feet of water under the cliff at the Prospeot end of the quarry Inspector Falvey,

who conducted 6.8, the inquiry, said he did not propose to offer

The Coroner said the case was a sad one A number of drownings of children had taken place in the quarry, and there seemed to be no protection of any kind around it. It was a most daugerous quarry and every-body knew that it was hard to keep shil-den away from such places. It was hard to blame children, and the onus was on the owcers of such places, when they were in a dangerous condition, to have them properly fenced. If the quarry in question was not looked after it was possible there would be other tragedies. He thought the owners should be compelled either by the proper authorities or the Garda to tence and close the querry in order to safeguard children in future

MI Daly, father of the deceased, said had known the quarry was a death drap for the past thirty years; the Corporation should have some facility with regard to fencing or closing it up

The Coroner said if the Corporation had any power they should take immediate

steps to make the place safe.

Inspector Falvey said that in addition to the place being dangerous it was used as a dumping ground and was a danger to the public health.

Sympathy was expressed with the be-reaved parents and the Coroner compli-mented Mesers Daly and Stackpools for thou work in recovering the body.
