

Young Sailor Drowned

Sad Limerick Tragedy

A sad drowning tragedy took place on the Shannon on Monday evening when a young sailor, Felix Brennan, stated to be a native of Scatterry Island, and whose father is one of the western Shannon pilots, lost his life.

It appears that the unfortunate young man was on board the Limerick S.S. Co's vessel, "Kylesclare," which was on her outward journey after clearing cargo at Limerick. Passing Barrington's Pier, Brennan was endeavouring to close a door on deck near the rails, when it swung back and struck him, knocking him overboard.

Deceased, who was aged 25, was only three weeks going to sea.

Up to the time of going to Press the body has not been recovered.
