Dr Michael Dominick Keily, Kosc Limerick born Plymouth doctor, and younger brother of the late Most Rev Dr. John Keily, Bishop of Plymouth from 1911 to 1920, has died, aged 64, two days after bis wife. One of the best known and beloved medical men in Southern England, Dr Keily was youngest son of the late Bartholomew Keily, of Limerick, and was for some time house surg on at the Limerick Lying In Hospital Dr Keily was a popular figure amongst all classes of the community in Plymouth. His work for the Catholic Church was outstanding. Two statues he gave in memory of his brother are at each side of the altar of Plymouth Pro cathedra!. He was a found. ation member of the St Vincent de Paul Society. For many years he has been the medical attendant at St Theresa's Orphau. age at Plymouth. Dr Keily was one of the grand old men of Plymouth, who made their reputation in the spacious days of the city, and whose numbers are sadly reduced to day.
