
Death of Mr M. Quilligan

A very estimable and popular figure has been removed from Limerick life by the death of Mr Michael Quilligan, Westfields, which took place rather unexpectedly on Saturday last. Deceased was very prominent in the business and social life of the city. The possessor of a good tenor voice, he was a member of the choir attached to the Augustinian Church for a number of years, and ever put himself at the disposal of organisers of entertainments for charitable purposes in the city. Like his father before him, the late Mr Con Quilligan, he took a keen interest in municipal affairs, and was a member of the Limerick Corporation as representative for the Irishtown Ward for a number of years. A comparatively young man he was open hearted, frank, cheerful and unassuming, qualities that won him into the hearts of a wide circle of friends. The funeral from Saint Munchin's Church to Mount St Lawrence Cemetery on Monday was a most representative gathering, being attended by the Mayor (Ald. D Bourke, T.D.), the members of the Limerick Corporation, the Licensed Vintners' Association, of which deceased was a member, and the citizens in general. To his bereaved sister, Nurse McMahon, also a very popular figure in the city, and other relatives, we wish to tender our deep sympathy.
