Priest's Death

The death has taken place in London of Very Rev John M Musgrave, Parish Priest of St Gabriel's, South Hallow, since 1935, and for 28 years previously Chaplain to Wormwood Scrubbs Prison.

The late Father Musgrave will be remembered by many of the Irish political
prisoners who passed through "The
Scrubbe." It was there that the famous
hunger strike began on April 21, 1920,
following the refusal of political treatment,
he 70 or so prisoners being eventually
released. During the strike Irish men and
women who gathered in great crowds round
the prison praying and waiting for news
were mobbed. In one attack some seventy
people, mostly won en, were injured.

Father Musgrave was born in London, parents came from the Cork Limerick border.
