Sudden Death.

To both of them and to the other members of the bereaved family deep sympathy will be extended.

Petrol Supplies.

Hackney drivers and private motorists in the town and district have been greatly relieved by the announcement made on Wednesday of the resumption of petrol supplies. Sales of the fuel were almost completely suspended in the town during the week-end, and there was a noticeable reduction in the number of cars on the road. Hackney drivers and delivery vans had to restrict their services for a day or two, but conditions appeared to be again normal on Thursday.

Another Death.

The death occurred on Sunday of Mrs. Margaret Mulcahy, wife of Mr. Daniel Mulcahy, Ballintubber, Newcastle West. Deceased was mother of Rev. James Mulcahy and Rev. Jeremiah Mulcahy, of the Diocese of San Francisco, and Sister Mary Ita, of the Community of the Holy Family Convent, Johannesburg.
