THE LAST MEMBER PASSES AWAY

LARGE AND REPRESENTATIVE FUNERAL

The last of the old famous Brass Band, Mr. Dan O'Grady, shopkeeper, of Bridge Street, Abbeyfeale, died in his 84th year after a long illness, thirty-three years after the death of Father Casey, who founded the band about 1879, and which for many years after found a prominent place at every Land and National League demonstration in Limerick, Cork and Kerry (writes our Abbeyfeale correspondent). There were many remarkable incidents associated with its historic itinerary, and not always were its instruments free from the scars of war whenever a baton charge interfered with its national airs. Dan O'Grady did his part with his old comrades of the band, but his artistic talent led him also into a prominent part in the repertory of the local Dramatic Society when it toured the neighbouring towns and villages forty odd years back. He was a humorist of the first order and carried its spirit in the humorous reminiscences he recalled up to the last quarter decade of his span. Only a few days previously his wife died also, at the age of 72, a lady who had many relatives in Brosna and Knocknagoshel. There was a very large attendance of the public at both funerals. The prayers at the graveside were said on both occasions by the Very Rev. Canon Hogan P.P., V.F.; Rev. J. Houlihan, C.C., and Rev. W. J. Meade, C.C., in St. Mary's Cemetery.

The funeral of the late Mr. Kennelly, of Clare View Avenue, Limerick, who on New Year's Day, took place on the 3rd. The remains were interred in Michael's Church at 7.2nd. Solemn Requiem Mass at 10.30 a.m. next day by the Very Rev. John Kennelly, Rector of St. Mary's College, Freshfield, Limerick, assisted by Father O'Sullivan, C.C., the Rev. Father Lyons, and other clergy present. The other clergy present were: Father Carroll, Adm.; Rev. J. C.C.; Rev. Father Charles White, C.C.; Very Rev. Gubbins, S.J., Rector of St. Mary's; Rev.
