**DEATH OF MRS. K. REIDY,
RATHKEALE**

It is with very deep regret that we
have to announce the death of Mrs. K.
Reidy, Lower Main Street, Rathkeale,
which occurred at the County Hospital,
Croom. Deceased was the widow of the
late John Reidy, a member of a well-
known Rathkeale family. An honest,
industrious woman who was an exem-
plary Catholic in her daily life and in
her attention to her religious duties, she
was held in high esteem, especially by
those who knew her intimately.

Her passing will be regretted by many
men who played a prominent part in the
Anglo-Irish War (1918-'21). During the
darkest period of that struggle, they
found welcome and refuge in her house
and her family were always ready to
assist them in their efforts to elude the
enemy.

The remains were removed to St.
Mary's Church, Rathkeale, on Friday,
27th December, and the funeral, which
was most representative and of extremely
large dimensions, took place to the New
Cemetery, Rathkeale, on Saturday, 28th.

Finn, P.P., Coolcappa.
